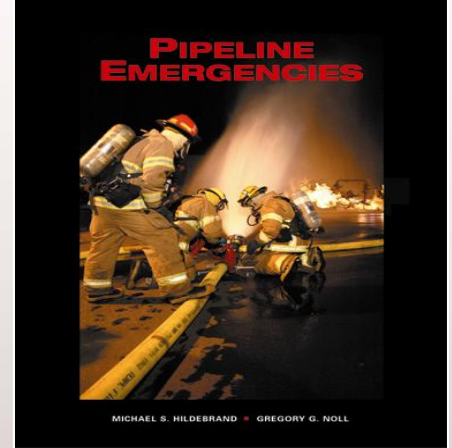

PIPELINE EMERGENCIES

A Train-the-Trainer Program Coming to Arizona

From the National Association of State Fire Marshals
and the U.S. Department of Transportation's Office of Pipeline Safety in conjunction
with the Western Regional Gas Conference

On August 25, veteran firefighter Glen Rudner will teach a one-day seminar on how to effectively respond to pipeline emergencies. The seminar organized by the National Association of State Fire Marshals for the US DOT Office of Pipeline Safety, based on *Pipeline Emergencies*, a textbook developed by Mike Hildenbrand and Greg Noll. The class will be held in conjunction with the, in conjunction with the Western Regional Gas Conference. The book and seminar will present a common sense approach to understanding liquid and gas pipeline system operations. The seminar will also provide practical, scenario-based training to help first responders prepare to successfully handle pipeline emergencies. All seminar participants will receive a textbook as well as a companion instructor CD-ROM containing interactive PowerPoint programs, scenarios, exercises and printable tests. A DVD movie will also be provided.



About the Trainer - **Glen D. Rudner** is a Hazardous Materials Response Officer for the Virginia Department of Emergency Management. He is currently assigned to the Northern Virginia area and is responsible to provide guidance and assistance to local governments and state agencies during hazardous materials emergencies. If necessary, make entry into hazardous areas for the purpose of assessment or mitigation and assist in the development and maintain a state hazardous materials emergency response program and to enhance local hazardous materials emergency response capabilities. He has 32 years experience in public safety including 12 years as a career firefighter/hazardous materials specialist for the City of Alexandria (VA) Fire Department, as well as a former volunteer EMT, firefighter, and an officer. He has instructed numerous hazardous materials programs and assisted in the development of the Virginia Department of Emergency Management Hazardous Materials Awareness, Operations, Technician, and Advanced Tactical Control Programs. His involvement in the area of terrorism includes assisting in the development of The Virginia Department of Emergency Management Public Safety Response to Terrorism Awareness, Incident Management, Tactical Considerations, and Haz Mat Team Operations programs.

He has served as a consultant and assisted in development for many of the original FBI hazardous materials training programs. Glen was a technical consultant for the Hazardous Materials Operations, Tactical Operations, and Technician programs and has served as a course manger and lead instructor. As a consultant for Computer Science Corporation, he has traveled throughout Central Asia, the Baltics, Balkans, and other countries to instruct WMD courses within the DOD/FBI/DHS International Counterproliferation Program. He has been instrumental in the development of many programs that are delivered by the Department of Justice, Office of Justice Programs. He has served as a subject matter expert for the Office of Justice Programs and DHS as well as a third party reviewer for many publications. He has written multiple articles for *Fire Engineering*, *Homeland Preparedness Professional*, and *Domestic Preparedness* magazines as well as being a voting member for the NFPA 472 Hazardous Materials and the IAFC Hazardous Materials Committees.
